

First Edition. 2 Vols., March 1773, 79 pp., plus 2 pp. book ads; May 1773, 87 pp. Both issues are believed to have been the personal property of Henry Knox, with his authenticated signature above the mastheads. These probably came from his book shop in Boston, pre-Revolutionary War. Henry Knox became Major General Knox during the Revolutionary War and George Washington's first secretary of war. Both issues have pale, bluish-gray covers. The rear cover is missing from the March issue. Covers are aged, soiled, stained, dog-eared, creased and chipped. Spines gone. Edges are aged, curled and chipped. Interiors are aged, dog-eared, creased and, occasionally, very slightly foxed. The May issue is in somewhat better condition than the March issue. Several pages are unopened. Considering their age, rarity, and historical significance, they are in surprisingly good condition. Good. Wraps. (#4854) \$500.00

A wonderfully detailed chart of the disastrous (for the Americans) “Penobscot Expedition.” The August, 1779 battle at Castine, Maine was the most significant military and naval action in Maine during the American Revolution. The outcome was a stinging defeat of the Americans by a much smaller English force. Paul Revere, who commanded the artillery forces, and Dudley Saltonstall, who commanded the naval forces, both faced court martials as a result of the fiasco. This chart is heavily annotated with descriptions of the battle and the British ships are individually named. It is an exquisite piece of Maine history during the War for Independence. Includes a photograph of renowned painter Thomas Moran sketching at Bright Angel Cove and a photograph of a train bridge passing over Canon Diablo and being observed by a Native American duo. Each stereoscopic view contains a full text explanation of the image on the rear and a short caption at the base in six languages. The author, Frederick S. Interior meets all points outlined in BAL 16378, title page in red and black, laid paper, brown coated endpapers, etc. except for the fact that this is the clothbound edition that appears to be as rare as the leather bound version. For many years it was thought that the leather version was the only one produced. Ahearn, "Collected Books," p. 552 lists a cloth first as being produced as well in 1883. 

Leather label affixed to case, “Proof Plates to Cook’s Voyages,” is incorrect as there are no Proof Plates in the atlas, only the plates called for in the completed edition. Very Good. Full Leather.

A stunning set that is one of the high points in published works on exploration.
